Please note that, although your requests encompass records of the entire DOL, our office will be responding to your FOIA request only with respect to records maintained by the OWCP/DLHWC.

Your letter requested the following documents created between January 20, 2009 and the present:

- 1. Copies of all contracts between the Department and outside Legal counsel;

- 2. Copies of all contracts between the Department and contractors who have been engaged to work on regulatory issues including rule writing; and
