- 2. Copies of all contracts between the Department and contractors who have been engaged to work on regulatory issues including rule writing; and
 - (B) Copies of all correspondence between the Department and contractors regarding the performance of such contracts.

My staff conducted a search for materials in formats that was reasonably calculated to uncover all documents or information responsive to your FOIA request. Enclosed are the responsive documents. Redactions have been made pursuant to FOIA Exemption 5 and FOIA Exemption 6. ILAB is committed to the principles of openness and transparency in making disclosure determinations, and it is the policy of the Department of Labor to disclose information to the maximum extent practicable. See C.F.R. § 70.3.

You have the right to appeal my determination within 90 days from the date of this response. 29 C.F.R. §70.22. The appeal must be in writing and must state the grounds for an appeal, including any supporting statement or arguments.
