SUBJECT: Official Time Usage Report for Fiscal Year 2012

The Bureau of Engraving and Printing is an industrial security printing facility, employing approximately 1,898 persons at plants in Washington, D.C. and Fort Worth, Texas. The workforce is organized into 19 bargaining units, comprised of numerous distinct crafts, a production support group, a clerical/technical group, and police officers. There are approximately 1,234 bargaining unit employees between both facilities. Eighteen (18) labor-management agreements are in effect.

Official time usage in Fiscal Year 2012

The total number of hours used for official time in Fiscal Year (FY) 2012 for both facilities is estimated at **4,751** hours. The breakdown of total hours used for official time for both facilities is as follows:

Methodology

The report of official time used was compiled from file records of official time usage for representational activities including contract negotiations, impact and implementation meetings, Joint Labor Council meetings, grievances and arbitrations. Estimates of official time used were projected from these records.

Comparison and Explanation for Official Time Usage

In FY 2012, the Bureau's official time usage increased by approximately 273 hours from the previous fiscal year. The majority of the hours used were in Category III-Dispute Resolution and Category IV-General Labor-Management Relations. There was a slight increase in the dispute resolution category mostly due to miscellaneous grievances filed by various unions which were resolved through negotiated grievance procedures.

The increase in Category IV, General Labor-Management Relations, was mainly as a result of the Bureau transitioning to a new performance pay-out matrix to be used in lieu of the Goal Sharing Program in-keeping with guidance from the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) regarding monetary awards for Federal workers. As a result, there were several briefings held with all unions. Also, management continued to involve the unions in pre-decisional discussions by providing the Joint Labor Council an opportunity to meet with Executives on a more frequent basis to provide feedback on policy updates and new initiatives.
