This is in reference to your request (tracking number 680404) dated February 24, 2012, made pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. § 552. You requested all letters to Secretary Solis from any member organizations or affiliated of the Building and Construction Trades Division (BCTD) of the AFL-CIO from January 1, 2010 to the present. You also requested all controlled correspondence from the Department of Labor to the BCTD for the same time period.

A search of our records revealed no responsive documents.

As no significant amount of staff time or resources were used to process this request, all fees and costs were waived.
